AN APPROPRIATE RESPONSE TO THE SOVIET MURDER OF THE 269 PASSENGERS AND CREW OF KOREAN AIRLINES FLIGHT 007

Sticks and stones will break my bones,
But names will never hurt me.

This childhood jingle reminds us that there are situation shown words are inadequate and deeds are demanded.

The cold-blooded, premeditated destruction of the 269 passengers and crew of Korean Airlines Flight 007 by Soviet missiles demands appropriate action as well as words of condemnation. What action should be taken?

Mrs. Larry McDonald, mourning the death of her husband who was traveling on the plane, struck a responsive chord in many when she made an impassioned plea for strong action against the Soviet Union to complement the strong rhetoric of President Reagan. Cosmetic and symbolic actions of a temporary nature, such as the closure of the inactive Aeroflot office in new York , are obviously inadequate. Harsher penalties must be imposed if the Soviet Union is to be deterred from similar acts in the future. What should these penalties be?

President Reagan asks his critics this simple question: "What do you suggest I should do? Should we go to war?" Considering the nature of nuclear war, very few would advocate taking such a step. The son of Larry McDonald stated in a television interview that war must be avoided.

The freedom of action of President Reagan is limited by two objective factors:

1. He must not risk, or appear to be risking, the promotion of nuclear war.
2. He must not impose an excessive economic burden on one section of the community. If he does, that section will respond at the polls with undesirable political consequences. U.S. farmers would oppose the re-imposition of the grain embargo. U.S. businessmen would oppose regulations and legislation that would prevent their proceeding with deals that will bring them profit; and the leaders and people of other nations would resent real or imagined U.S. pressure to take actions they do not wish to take. As president, these factors must be taken into account. The net result is to reverse President Teddy Rosevelt: to, "speak loudly and carry a small stick." It is not surprising that many feel angry and frustrated.

An Effective Response

There is something that can be done which will create great difficulties for one of the major objectives of the Soviet Union without increasing the likelihood of nuclear war and without imposing involuntary burdens on one segment of the U.S. people. To discern this, it is necessary to comprehend the primary objective of the Soviet Union.

The Primary Soviet Objective

Konstantin Chernenko, who is generally regarded as the No. 2 man in the Soviet Union, recently stated that the Soviet Union was willing to make any national sacrifices which would advance the cause of the "World Dictatorship of the Proletariat." (See April 15 newsletter, The World Dictatorship of the Proletariat is synonym for "World Communist Conquest.")

Soviet actions confirm that this statement is true., Specific actions are: The investment of \$8 million a day to maintain the communist dictatorship of Cuba; the use of Soviet troops to maintain communist dictatorships in Afghanistan, Hungary, and Czechoslovakia; and the expenditure of enormous sums to produce armaments greatly in excess of those needed for the defense of the Soviet Union.

Stopping Communist Conquest

Anything that impedes the communist program for world conquest deals the Soviet Union a devastating blow. The program which the communists are following in order to secure world domination is summarized by the formula: "External encirclement, plus internal demoralization, plus thermonuclear blackmail, lead to progressive surrender." The success of encirclement depends upon progressively adding third world countries to the communist empire. The addition of each country tips the balance of power slightly and provides another country to militarize and thereby threaten neighboring countries in favor of the Soviet Union. To understand this is to understand the importance of the "civil wars" which are taking place in such countries as El Salvador, Guatemala, and the Philippines.

The success of the communist program to enlarge the Soviet Empire by addition of third world countries depends upon the soviet ability to: 1. Enlist, train and supply a group to lead the insurrection in that country; 2. to persuade large numbers of the population in the target countries that the Soviet Union is dedicated to peace, prosperity, and freedom.

The Soviet Union is investing tremendous resources of both personnel and finance in order to persuade the idealistic students and the people in third world countries that the soviet Union creates prosperity and is peace-loving, humane, enlightened, and dedicated to increasing the well-being of the downtrodden.

If both the intellectuals and the masses of the people in these countries receive accurate information concerning communist brutality, contempt for human life and willingness to propagate the most blatant lies, the ability of the communists to deceive and enlist them will be greatly diminished. Accurate information concerning the Soviet action in shooting down Korean Airlines Flight 007 and their reaction to the protests of the relatives of the victims will provide irrefutable evidence of such brutality, contempt for life, and scorn for the truth.

Remember the Lesson

Memories fade. The communists are counting upon the short memory-span of the majority of the people of the world to diminish any hostility caused by their barbarity. They believe that other incidents will soon occupy the attention of most people and that the memory of this incident will grow dim. Their expectation will be shattered if the lessons taught by this incident are retained in the consciousness of the people they seek to deceive and recruit.

Practical Steps

Deliberate efforts must be made to retain these lessons within public consciousness. The following steps should be taken:

1. Research

A team of research journalists should be employed to seek out the relatives of the murdered victims in order to record their stories of heartbreak and suffering. There are 269 dramatic stories that can be told. Demonstrators appear on television screens carrying placards with such statements as; "You killed my mother." "I want my baby back." "You murdered my son." These people should be interviewed and their reports recorded on tape. From the dramatic material thus gathered, a number of books should be written and a stream of articles should be published in magazines and newspapers full of drama and human interest. The issue would not then fade away and die.

Obviously the books and articles should be written and published in many languages.

2. Films

Films should be produced which depict dramatically the human plight of the passengers and crew of the plane. The appeal of films showing aircraft in danger has already been demonstrated many times. All the ingredients of a film with immense public appeal are present in this tragedy.

Film producers have often seized upon dramatic incidents that have happened around the world and have used them to discredit the United States. Examples are such films as, "Missing" and "Apocalypse Now". Surely there are some

patriotic film producers who have the vision to see the potential such a film would have in the United States, and surely there are businessmen who would invest in such a project.

The film must be dramatic and popular, but it should also display the connection between communist doctrines and Soviet deeds. This could be done by presenting dramatically the statements made by the Soviet foreign minister, Andrei Gromyko, at the Madrid Conference on European Cooperation and Security which took place Wednesday, the 7th of September, 1983. In reply to charges by U.S. secretary of State, Schultz, he cold-bloodedly justified the shooting down of the plane and affirmed that the Soviet Union would do the same thing again in similar circumstances. There was no hint of penitence or apology.

Such a film or series of films would be a profitable commercial venture within the United States. However, films should also be produced for the people of Latin America, Asia, Africa and Europe. They should be of the highest quality and use the idiom of the local language as well as popular local actors. The dramatic presentation of truth concerning the Soviet destruction of the plane and the murder of 269 people would lead naturally to a discussion of communist doctrine and morality, and the nature of the Soviet regime.

These films would need special financing, which could be provided by the U.S. Information Agency, private educational institutions, or charitable foundations.

I suggest that immediate steps be taken to produce such a film for distribution in Central America, South America, and the Caribbean. This would involve:

- a. The employment of competent script writers using the Spanish language.
- b. The recruitment of an experienced producer and director of Spanish films
- c. The employment of Spanish actors.

As soon as it is produced, the film should be shown in every school in Latin America.

Similar films should be produced for other major countries. Obviously these countries would include Korea and Japan where the concern about his incident is very great. There is even a possibility that a film in Chinese, utilizing Chinese actors, could be shown on mainland China.

The Costs

How much would such a program cost? While no precise estimate can be made, scores of millions of dollars would be needed. Most major U.S. films and books could be born by investors who would legitimately seek a profit, but in other countries the films and literature would need to be subsidized.

We have been advocating that a sum equal to one percent of the military budget be utilized by the U.S. Government in a massive worldwide truth campaign. If a sum of this magnitude were available, the campaign to imprint the lessons of this latest Soviet slaughter deeply in the consciousness of the people of the world could go into operation immediately. It would diminish, rather than increase, the danger of nuclear conflict; and it would not impose an excessive burden on any section of the American people.

Such a campaign will hit the communists where it hurts, and they will think long and soberly before engaging in a similar action in the future. Many lives will be saved, and the communist campaign for world conquest will suffer a severe blow.

THE ANATOMY OF SOVIET DISINFORMATION

The LOS ANGELES TIMES of September 9 carried a full-page advertisement by pornographer Larry Flynt, the publisher of HUSTLER magazine. The advertisement gave Larry Flynt's interpretation of the Soviet destruction of

Korean Airlines Flight 007 with the loss of 269 lives. It revealed for more about the mental state of Larry Flynt than it did about the cause of the tragedy.

Flynt presented the idea that Larry McDonald enticed the Soviet forces to shoot down the plane in order to make himself a martyr and to promote hostility against the Soviet Union.

On September 12 the newspaper, PRAVDA, published by the Communist Party of the Soviet Union, reported the delirious ravings of Flynt as though they represented the viewpoint of the LOS ANGELES TIMES. this led to this indignant rebuttal by the TIMES:

"Pravda, the Soviet Communist Party daily, on Monday published a Tass dispatch from San Francisco saying that the Los Angeles Times had printed an article stating that 'the incident with the South Korean airplane is not a tragic accident, but a pre-planned provocation, one of many such amoral actions which mark the history of the U.S.A.'"

"There was no such article published in the news or editorial columns of The Times. the Tass dispatch was based, instead, on a clearly labeled advertisement in Friday's Times, an ad paid for by Hustler magazine and presenting the views of it publisher, Larry Flynt..."

"The Time policy on advertisements dealing with public affairs is to screen the proposed wording for libel or factual inaccuracies but not to reject an ad on the basis of the opinions expressed in it."

Such is Soviet "TRUTH".

LESSONS FROM THE FORMULA FOR THE COMMUNIST CONQUEST OF THE U.S.A. (Part 3)

INTERNAL DEMORALIZATION

The role encirclement plays in the communist program to conquer the United States was discussed in our September 1 newsletter. Progressive encirclement is an important and essential element in communist strategy, but it must be complemented by weakening the United States internally so that surrender at the appropriate time will take place.

Neither the external or internal communist danger can be understood in isolation. Both magnify the total communist threat as both length and breadth magnify the area of the rectangle. An alternative method of expressing the communist formula for the conquest of the U.S.A. WOULD BE: EXTERNAL ENCIRCLEMENT, MULTIPLIED BY INTERNAL DEMORALIZATION, MULTIPLIED BY THERMONUCLEAR BLACKMAIL, LEAD TO PROGRESSIVE SURRENDER.

Communist Objectives in the U.S.A.

The communist regard their work within the United States as vital. This does not mean that they expect to convert a majority or even a major segment of the U.S. people to communism. The communist program for conquest could succeed even if there were not one communist nor communist sympathizer in the United States. If an intruder enters a house and points a gun at the occupants, the likelihood is that those occupants will obey him even though they do not approve of his conduct or philosophy. Resistance will appear suicidal. So most people would allow the intruder to bind them hand and foot rather than engage in some action which would cause him to shoot them immediately.

If the communist program of encirclement reaches the point where the communists can credibly offer only two alternatives, surrender or death, it is probable that most people would prefer surrender to suicide, however much they may detest communism.

However, the communist are not depending upon encirclement alone. They are exceedingly active within the U.S.A. and regard their work here as very important. Its objective is three-fold:

1. Convert a few people to communism. These few will be faithful servants of their Soviet masters. They will distribute communist propaganda, spread disinformation, engaged in espionage, and stand ready to serve the Soviets in any requested capacity. In the event of communist conquest, they will provide a vehicle thorough which the Soviet

Union can rule.

2. Create a substantial group of sympathizers with Marxism among the educated classes.
3. Destroy the patriotism, love of family, and unselfish altruism of the youth.

1. CONVERSION OF THE FEW

The U.S. Communist Party is not a major political party in the U.S.A. and there is no likelihood that communist candidates will be elected to public office in the foreseeable future. Despite this, the Party is among substantial progress, and its influence is far from negligible. It publishes the daily newspaper, the DAILY WORLD in New York; the weekly newspaper the PEOPLE'S WORLD, in San Francisco; and the monthly theoretical magazine, POLITICAL AFFAIRS.

The Party has just raised more than half a million dollars on behalf of the DAILY WORLD. A report in the August 31, 1983 edition by Hector Rivera states:

"The Daily World Half Million Dollar High Tech Fund Drive has gone over the top!"

"The goal was over fulfilled Tuesday as monetary gifts continue to arrive. The Daily World will continue to acknowledge the receiving of gifts for the drive and if people are planning to make a gift but haven't yet, they can still get it in.

"The fund will pay for the new computers which are being used to expand the paper's coverage and circulation.

"During the course of the drive, nearly several handwritten letters were sent in by people who also enclosed monetary gifts. There were several hundred gifts of \$5 and up which made the drive a total success. There were more than 100 \$1,000 or more contributions, which included large gifts from people who support other newspapers, including the Ukrainian News and the People's World." (Page 4-D)

the social and economic stature of a significant segment of the communists is revealed by the statement: "There were more than 100 \$1,000 or more contributions." Such contributions could hardly come from the poor, the unemployed or the minorities which are the constituencies the communist party claims to represent.

Communism is essentially a movement of the educated and the wealthy while the poor are the tools they seek to use to secure power.

The complete subordination of the members of the U.S. Communist Party to the Soviet Union is illustrated by articles in the DAILY WORLD and the PEOPLE'S WORLD justifying the shooting down of Korean Airlines Flight 007 with the loss of 269 lives.

2. CREATION OF SYMPATHIZERS:

While the converts to communism may be few, a large and growing group of educators are teaching college students that Marxism has many valuable insights and that it is preferable to capitalism in many respects. The situation is described in a book review by John Trink in the September 7, 1983 edition of the Marxist-Leninist newspaper, the GUARDIAN:

"There is a renaissance of Marxist studies underway. More than 400 courses on Marxist philosophy are offered in U.S. colleges; in the 1960s there were hardly any. Prestigious university publishers are increasingly bringing out books on Marx and Marxism. Crowning the renewed interest is the publication for the first time of the complete works of Marx and Engels in English -- some 20 volumes have already appeared in the projected 50-volume series.

"No doubt at least part of the reason for the revival of interest in Marx is that many of the student radicals of the 1960s are now the Marxist professors of the 1980s. Marxist critiques are written and thousands of students required to read

the old master." (Page 25)

the majority of these courses on Marxism would claim to present positive criticism. The professors would recoil in horror from the term "anti-Marxist." They are often critical of certain aspects of communism authoritarianism which they tend to blame Lenin, Stalin, and even Engels , while Marx is beautified.

There is little, if any, understanding of the truth that the unspeakable carnage in Cambodia can be traced directed to the influence of the teachings of Karl Marx upon Pol Pot and his associates in the Khmer Rouge; that Marxism is malignant.

The prospect of living in a Marxist world holds few terrors for the graduates of these classes on Marxism. They are effectively neutralized in the battle between communism and freedom.

3. DESTRUCTION OF PATRIOTISM, LOVE OF FAMILY, AND UNSELFISH ALTRUISM, OF THE YOUTH:

Napoleon said: "An army marches on its own stomach." It is true that an army needs food and weapons, but it also needs faith in its cause, discipline and courage. These combine to produce the intangible but vital condition known as "morale".

The importance of morale has been recognized for many centuries. An English poet expressed the importance of morale when he wrote:

Vain! Mightiest fleets of iron framed,
Vain! Those all-shattering guns,
Unless proud England keep untamed,
The stout hearts of her sons.

The communists are well aware of the importance of morale, and they are confident that the morale of their forces is superior to that of the forces of imperialism and that this assures their victory. Tomas Borge, one of the founders of the Sandinista National Liberation Front (FSLN), of Nicaragua and presently Minister of the Interior of that country, affirmed this when he was interviewed by a group of visiting Canadians. Referring to the "counter-revolutionary bands" which are fighting against the Sandinista organizations of Nicaragua, and which he regards as agents in the U.S., he stated:

"They have also been trying to carry out an analysis of the correlation of forces. They have been doing their own calculations. They say, 'well, they have so many tanks, so much artillery, so much infantry, so many planes.' So they have done their own calculations of how much we have, and how much they have, how many soldiers, etc. They have done mathematical calculations of the correlation of forces.

"But the idiots don't know that this kind of calculation is useless, that there are other factors that go beyond questions of how many munitions we have, how many meters of cannons. What they have forgotten is the will, the commitment, the morale, the combativity, of a revolutionary people." (Intercontinental Press, Sep. 19, 1983, p. 515)

The communist objective is to destroy the will to resist the American people. This can be done by diminishing the faith of American youth in the cause of their country, weakening the institutions that make a country strong and fostering the cult of self-indulgence. Once the youth of America are convinced that the sensory pleasures of this life constitute the highest value, no cause will justify the surrender of life. They may be conscripted into armies, but if they do not believe the cause of their country is just, they will make poor soldiers indeed.

Large number of educators and communicators are undermining the faith of the U.S. youth in their country. Patriotism is belittled, even scorned. The fathers of the nation are transformed from courageous heroes into greed, self-aggrandizing slave masters. The United States is portrayed as an imperialist vulture sucking the life blood from the poor nations of the earth. It is not surprising that many believe it would be idiocy to die in the service of such a country.

THE BREZHNEV DOCTRINE

The deadly Brezhnev Doctrine, which has guided Soviet policy for many years, and which is responsible for Soviet intervention in Afghanistan and Poland, was stated by Brezhnev in these words:

"When internal and external forces that are hostile to socialism try to turn the development of some socialist country towards the restoration of a capitalist regime, when socialism in that country and the socialist community as a whole are threatened, it become not only a problem of the country but a common problem of all socialist countries... Naturally such an action as military assistance to a fraternal country designed to avert the threat to the social system is an extraordinary step, dictated by necessity." (L.I. Brezhnev: Following Lenin's Course, Progress Publishers, Moscow, 1972)

Note that the communists use the term "socialist" to define a country that is ruled by communist dictatorship. Thus, Russia is the U.S.S.R., or the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

The Brezhnev Doctrine certainly applies to Cuba. Does it apply to Nicaragua?

Dear Friend and Colleague,

Another anti-communist seminar will be held for church leaders and Christian workers in Costa Rica. The conducting team will be led by the Rev. James Colbert. We will provide accommodation, food and minimal traveling expenses for those who attend.

Some have written suggesting that a fund be opened as a memorial for Congressman Larry McDonald who devoted his life to fighting communism and was killed by the communist when they shot down Korean Airlines Flight 007. We invite you to contribute to a Larry McDonald Memorial Fund which will be used to inform people of the world of the deadly nature and evil intentions of communism. Mrs. McDonald will be informed of the thoughtful and loving concern of all those who send a contribution in memory of her husband.

To tell the people of the world of the whole truth about communism is to defeat and destroy it. It is for this purpose we need your generous, sacrificial support.
